As required by law, I understand that the lien of taxes is imposed as of January 1st. If I sell or go out of business after January 1st, I am still responsible for the taxes on my Real Estate and Personal Property.

I also understand that my business will continue to be levied for Real Estate and Tangible Personal Property taxes until the Tax Collector's Office is in receipt of a Going Out Of Business Notice.

I also acknowledge that under Florida Statute 607, a corporation may not dissolve until all debts have been satisfied and as an officer of the corporation I may be personally liable for any debts or obligations that remain of the corporation.

I as owner or representative for the business understand any person who violates this part is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in F.S. 775.082 or F.S. 775-083 and will abide by the provisions of Chapter 559, Part III, Florida Statutes.
